I solemnly swear that I was born at Constantinople - Turkey on or about the 6th day of February, 1886. that my husband Constantine emigrated to the United States, sailing on board of the St. Michael from Liverpool on or about October, 1893, that he resided 18 years, uninterruptedly, in the United States, from 1893, to 1911, at New York City & New London, Conn.; that he was naturalized as a citizen of the United States before the Common Pleas Court of Connecticut at New London, Connecticut, on September 18th, 1899, as shown by the accompanying Certificate of Naturalization; that I am the wife of the person described in said Certificate; that I have resided in the United States, uninterruptedly, for 8 years, from 1903 to 1911, at New London, Ct.; that I am domiciled in the United States, my permanent residence being at New London, in the State of Connecticut, where I follow the occupation of Housewife; that I am about to go abroad temporarily; and that I intend to return to the United States within one month, with the purpose of residing and performing the duties of citizenship therein.
