

The original and each copy of an application for a passport must have attached to it a copy of the applicant's photograph. A loose signed photograph of the applicant must accompany the application. The photographs must be on thin paper, should have a light background, and be not over three inches in size.

\*This blank must be completely filled out. The legal fee of one dollar, in currency or postal money order, and the applicant's certificate of naturalization must accompany the application. The rules should be carefully read before mailing the application to the Department of State, Bureau of Citizenship, Washington, D. C.

I, Socrates Patterson, a NATURALIZED AND LOYAL CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES, hereby apply to the Department of State, at Washington, for a passport.

for myself and my minor child George Patterson who was born in New London Connecticut Apr. 23/1908

I solemnly swear that I was born at Vathi Green on September 28<sup>th</sup>, 1872; that my father, Nicholas Papanagosti (Name.), was born in Green (Country.) and is now dead; that I emigrated to the United States, sailing from Constantinople about October 20<sup>th</sup>, 1893; that I resided 26 years, uninterruptedly, in the United States, from 1893 to 1920 at New York City and New London Conn.; that I was naturalized as a citizen of the United States before the

Court of Common Pleas at New London Connecticut on September 18<sup>th</sup>, 1899, as shown by the Certificate of Naturalization presented herewith; that I am the IDENTICAL PERSON described in said Certificate; that I have resided outside the United States since my naturalization at the following places for the following periods:

Turkey, from January 1905 to September 1905

and that I am domiciled in the United States, my permanent residence being at New London in the State of Connecticut, where I follow the occupation of Merchant

My last passport was obtained from Washington D.C. on January 1905 and was misplaced or lost (Disposition of passport.)
